#### From The Chairman



It's that time of year again! #### **Opening Day**

Of course, you can always play Golf instead if that's your forte, as one lawn will be dedicated to you.

#### Winter News

The AGM in November managed to take place without any catering diversions again. Special thanks to Kate Sanders again for her food and to her helpers with the food and drink. One major item was a Constitution change making the financial year end in December, so the next AGM will now be in February 2012. Competition prizes will probably be presented on Finals Day in future - 25<sup>th</sup> September this year.

The Winter Warmer evening at the Sanders was attended by more than 20 members. Excellent food and drink were provided and the raffle had a special prize of a Fish & Chip Supper in a box: sardines, a potato, oil, salt and vinegar! Thanks to Kate and Mike for hosting this.

Our One Balls on the first Sunday in the month have been more successful than last year; we managed to run four of them with 8 people turning up in March.

Pub lunches were attended with between 13 and 20 members, so we'll continue to run these through next winter.

Sadly, we've also had a couple of deaths of our members over the winter.

- Joan Whitehead hadn't been seen much over the last couple of years, as she'd broken an arm and had a few other problems, and had already decided not to renew this year. She enjoyed playing Association and was a special friend of Stan Oxenbury. Her death, at 95, was still a shock.
- Miriam Reader died on 19<sup>th</sup> December at the age of 82. She was well known to everyone as a staunch supporter of the club, enthusiastic Association and Golf player, team and committee member, flag raiser, parking space supplier and washer-up on many occasions, mostly unasked.
  - Her funeral, was standing room only, and was attended by people from many other croquet clubs in addition to her equine-loving friends and family, and we raised £450 for one of the nominated charities Macmillan Cancer Support. Her nephew wrote after the funeral:
  - "I would like to say how good it was to see you and so many of the croquet club on Friday. Miriam who didn't like fuss when it came to her, would I'm sure, have been very pleased. My wife Liz & I were touched about the comments and stories we heard and we learnt many things about Miriam that we were unaware of. She always spoke very highly about the

croquet club and I can see why! We didn't get to speak to everyone as the numbers that turned up were fantastic but having spoken to so many we feel we would like to turn up one weekend to see Miriam's name in print at the club."

Miriam left us £1,000 as a bequest, which we hope to spend wisely. [As a Community Amateur Sports Club any bequest to us is free of Inheritance Tax.] As a tribute to her we've renamed one of her favourite competitions, the Association Doubles, as the Miriam Reader Memorial Doubles. She will be much missed.

## **Secretary's Notes**

Please see below about entering various competitions and tournaments. However, if you're playing an internal match you should reserve a lawn in advance in the Diary Book in the Club House. You may have to double-bank, especially if a match is in progress.

Please remember that ALL lawns are expected to be in use during Tournaments and on main club afternoons. On days when we've got other events scheduled at least one main lawn **should** be available. Don't forget that the master club diary is on the website, so you can always check there before turning up on spec, however it doesn't contain lawn reservations for internal matches.

#### **Lawns Report**

Our lawns have come through the exceptionally cold and wet winter reasonably well. The snow mould is now disappearing and hopefully we'll be able to cut them shorter soon.

Please help in the care of lawns by avoiding playing on lawns showing signs of wear around the hoops, avoiding play after heavy rain, and marking balls with the plastic markers not coins when you're double-banking. Please obey the notices on the Notice Board, showing which lawns are Open and which are Closed.

Jump shots: practising is a really good idea, but practising jump shots can damage the lawns. So we've put holes for a hoop underneath the bank on Lawn 1. When you want to practise these please put out a hoop specially into these holes, then you won't cause any damage to the main lawns!

Ray also mentioned that whoever had 'filled in' some patches had left the soil slightly too proud and his experience was that this could be a significant contributor to mower blade blunting. We don't want that as sharpening them takes a long time, and if we have to replace them it can cost £400.

He also found the Ball Store open. There has been some difficulty with the door and the lock, so could you make sure that it's locked when you leave...

Finally, divot repairers are now available in the Club House, price £3. These should be a part of everyone's kit bag, so that if you (accidentally of course) break the surface of the lawn you can do what all golfers do – repair the surface by drawing the two sides of the break together again. This will prevent your fault from affecting other people.

## Handicapping

We want all players to keep a card, available in the Club House - White for Association and Green for Golf, and record on them all the singles games you play. For club competitions, tournaments and any external games, you will use the system of adding or subtracting points after each game. You don't need to record friendly games, but it would be helpful for adjusting your handicap if you do so (without changing the index).

This means that if you play only friendlies or doubles you won't have any automatic change to your handicap. However, if you are improving and require a lower handicap before you start playing 'serious' games, then the results of all your friendlies will help decide on any necessary adjustment to your handicap. John Hobbs (as club handicapper), will do the adjusting assisted by Frank Gunstone and Duncan Cox for Golf Croquet.

We have raised the issue of other clubs' handicaps at the SECF and they're trying to do something, as a first step each club now has to have a nominated club handicapper, who's responsible for their clubs' handicaps.

## Coaching

We've got two one day coaching sessions planned in May organised by Daphne Gaitley on behalf of the SECF, one for Golf and one for Association in May. The Association one is aimed at handicap 18+ and will be held on 20<sup>th</sup> May. The Golf one is on 27<sup>th</sup> May.

The cost for a one day session is £15, including lunch, coffee and tea. There may be the option on the Golf day of a morning or afternoon session, if so the cost will be £10. Please sign up on the form on the Notice Board or let Jon Diamond know.

If you're interested in Association then Jolyon Creasey is undertaking a one day session for his Waldron beginners on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> May in TW. If you're interested in attending please contact him directly or via Jon Diamond.

We're also planning a 6 session Introduction to Croquet run by John Hobbs, taking people who haven't picked up a mallet before into both Golf and Association. Dates haven't been sorted out, but this will start at the end of April/beginning of May, one session per week and cost £25 to non-members of the club, deductible from membership if they join at the end of the course. If you're interested in Association then this may be for you, although you won't need the first session as you know all the one ball shots already! If you know of someone who might be interested then contact John Hobbs for more details.

Other coaching for beginners and high-bisquers in both codes will be masterminded by Richard Clark this year. He's not planning a formal schedule, but will no doubt be around quite a lot during various club sessions. If you'd like some coaching or advice please approach him directly and let him know your interests.

Don't forget there are many courses being run at Southwick – see the Diary below for more details.

## **Competitions and Tournaments**

First of all, we need all your Renewal Registrations in NOW so that we can do the draws for the Internal Year-long competitions that you will all be entering (lots, I hope ;-) We expect to publish these by Easter. Please enter for the Miriam Reader Memorial Doubles – it's a good way for high handicap players to get some one-to-one coaching from a much better player!

Apart from those events in the CA calendar which are already public, the South-East Federation Calendar has now been published and is on our notice-board and included in our Diary, as well as on their website. Please give these events a go as they are genuinely friendly and gentle ways of extending your croquet experience.

Next up will be the Inter-Club matches. In Association, we will be playing in three South East Croquet Federation (SECF) leagues. The A league is for the Advanced game, so we expect to put out our strongest team. The U league is Handicap, so we can put in people of any strength. John Hobbs is arranging these, so contact him to volunteer.

The SECF B league exists for beginners to have the fun of playing Association against members of other clubs and visiting their premises to see how other clubs do things (the team must have a total handicap of at least 48 when the match is **arranged**). Although we try to win these games, that comes

second to giving members the experience. Jeff Chapman has volunteered to organise these and, since we failed to complete all our games in this event last year, he'll need all the support you can give.

Duncan Cox will be chasing up similarly for the SECF Golf Leagues (see below).

We've entered teams into one of the SECF events at Southwick – Golf Teams on 7<sup>th</sup> August. We haven't entered a team for the Ladies Day as we don't have enough ladies playing Association to put up a team and we're haven't entered yet for the Association Team Doubles on 21 st/22<sup>nd</sup> May. However, if you'd like to play please contact me and I'll see what we can organise.

All players are welcome to our one-day Open Golf Croquet level play event on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> July, our Open Handicap Association Croquet event on Saturday/Sunday 13<sup>th</sup>/14<sup>th</sup> August and our Open Advanced Croquet event on Saturday/Sunday 11<sup>th</sup>/12<sup>th</sup> September.

For higher handicap players an Open Handicap Association Croquet event will take place on Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> September (Handicap 16+) and an internal High Bisquers on a Saturday sometime in August.

Entry forms for all our Open events will be on the website soon and in the Club House on the left hand wall. Please send them in, with your payment, to me as soon as possible.

The Kent Cup (Association) is being held here on  $4^{th}/5^{th}$  June. The Kent Cup (Golf) will be at Ramsgate on  $17^{th}$  July, please see the flyer in the Clubhouse for details of how to enter.

Finally, one event you can't enter is the World Golf Croquet Championships being held at Hurlingham and Surbiton in July. Several people will no doubt want to go as spectators (the play can be spectacular) and car sharing would be good, so put the dates in your diary (18th-24th July).

In addition to the clothing there are a few other items that members might wish to purchase with the logo on - a tote bag, mug etc.
